→ The Battle of
 Uhud was an extension
 of the Battle of Badr.

→ A large army of 3,000 of Quraysh of Makkah led by Abu Sufyan set out for Medina to avenge their defeat.

→ The Holy prophet (S.A.W) held a council of war to listen about the intentions.

→ According to the opinion of young muslims, the Holy prophet (S.A.W) agreed to meet the enemy in the open field outside Medina.

→ The number of the muslims force was 1,000 but on the way to the battle field, three hundred hypocrites led by Abdullah bin Ubayy withdrew and went to their homes.

- The Holy prophet (S.A.W.) was thus left with 700 persons only.
- The archers were commanded to take up their position at Uhud and not to abandon their posts under any circumstances.
- When the muslims broke the enemy's line and the Qurish fell back. The contingent of the muslims archers, contrary to the instructions of the Holy prophet (S.A.W.) left their position in order to plunder the camp of the retreating Qurish.
